Holywell Town Player Pen-Pics Season 2021/22

Keighan Jones GK - Jones signed for the Wellmen in the summer of 2021 and has firmly established himself as the first choice keeper. Jones is an experienced goalkeeper and lists Airbus UK Broughton, Caernarfon Town, Rhyl and Bala Town as his previous clubs. Great shot stopper and reads the game well.

Mike Platt GK - Platt returned to the Wellmen in the Autumn after a spell at Brickfield Rangers. Prior to playing for Gresford Athletic in the Huws Gray Alliance last season, Platt had a very successful time at Halkyn Road and was a member of the treble winning team which gained promotion into the old Huws Gray Alliance League.

Tony Roebuck - A fans Favourite who has been with the club for a number of years, Roebuck re-signed for the Wellmen after a years travelling around Australia. Roebuck has many years experience playing for the Wellmen and was a part of the treble winning side gaining promotion into the Huws Gray Alliance.

Jake Cooke - Cookie has established himself as a fans favourite and gives 100% in every game. Cooke has worked himself up from the youth set up of the club and now features in most of the games. Cooke is a skilfull player and has an eye for goal.

Danny Sullivan - Sullivan returned to the club in the summer of 2020 after we gained promotion to the JD Cymru League North. A versatile player who can play either in defence or midfield, Sully also scores his fair share of goals and his experience rubs off on the younger members of the squad. His previous clubs include Rhyl, Caernarfon Town and Denbigh Town.

Myles Hart - Myles signed for the Wellmen in December 2019 from Flint Town United but moved to Prestatyn Town later in the season. Hart returned to Halkyn Road in early 2021 and established himself into the side. Experienced player who is great on the ball, Hart's previous clubs include Prestatyn Town, Flint Town United and Airbus UK Broughton.

Zebb Edwards - Defender Edwards returned to Halkyn Road in the summer of 2020 and has established himself as the clubs left back. Edwards is a strong tough tackling defender who's previous clubs include Prestatyn Town, Llandudno, Airbus UK Broughton and Rhyl.

Ilan ap Gareth Jones - Ilan signed for the Wellmen in August 2020 from Rhyl FC. Midfielder Ilan is a great player and controls the midfield well. His previous clubs include Rhyl, Porthmadog and Cefn Druids.

Luke Edwards - Edwards signed for the club in and was a part of the Welsh National League winning side who gained promotion to the JD Cymru North. Edwards is a great player, has an eye for goal and very experienced and his previous clubs include Runcorn Town and St Saviours FC

Luke Wiltshire - Luke signed for the Wellmen in the autumn of 2020 and is a great member of the squad, Midfielder Wiltshire is composed on the ball and controls the midfield well. His previous clubs include Rhyl and Flint Town United.

Dylan Allshorn - Young Allshorn is becoming a fans favourite who all love to see him play. The tricky winger has speed and skill to beat his marker and his crosses from the wings bring a lot of goals to the side. His former sides include Flint Town United, Wrexham FC and Airbus UK Broughton.

Danny Andrews - Andrews signed for the club from Welsh Premier side Flint Town United in the summer of 2020 and has already notched up a number of goals for the side. His former clubs include Flint Town United, Colwyn Bay and Witton Albion.

Oliver Buckley - Buckley signed for the Wellmen in the summer of 2020 from Prestatyn Town. Buckley has grown into a valued member of the squad and has a few goals under his belt this season already. His previous clubs include Prestatyn Town, Rhyl and Meliden FC.

Dave Forbes - Forbes is an experienced striker who has a wealth of Welsh Premier experience from his previous clubs. Forbes has established himself into the side after picking up an injury pre-season, but it wont be long until we see his name regular on the scoresheet. His previous clubs include Cefn Druids, Connahs Quay Nomads, Rhyl and Runcorn Town.

Dave Hayes - Experienced Hayes is best known from his days at Prestatyn Town and represented their club in the Champions League a few years back. Hayes is an experienced player who can play either in defence or midfield. Hayes signed for the Wellmen in March 2020.

Alec Williams - Alec signed for the side in January 2020 and scored on his debut and instantly the fans took to him. Williams is an experienced striker who can also operate on the wing and has a keen eye for goal. His previous clubs include Prestatyn Town, Rhyl, Denbigh Town and Llandudno.

Ben Brierley - Ben signed for the Wellmen in the summer of 2019 from Flint Town United. Ben is a striker who has an eye for goal, and his fast and powerful play means he's a handful to defenders who mark him. His previous clubs include Flint Town United and FC Nomads.

Shaun Tuck - Tuck returned to the Wellmen earlier this season after a few seasons away from the club. Tuck is a fans favourite and his goals in previous stints at the club has earned him a fans favourite amongst Halkyn Road. Tuck's previous clubs include Bootle, Colwyn Bay, Runcorn Town and Penycae.

Mark Winslade - Wins is another fans favourite and has been a the club for a number of years. Winslade is a fast player with a keen eye for goal and his previous clubs include Cefn Druids, Flint Town United and Nantwich Town.



HOLYWELL TOWN FC

Holywell Town were founding members of both the Cymru Alliance and the League of Wales (now known as the Cymru Premier) and enjoyed their best period in the top flight in the mid-1990s. The history of football in Holywell can be traced back to a club that was simply known as Holywell, and it is credited that it was founded by a Colonel J.Llewellyn Williams. During those early days, Holywell played their football on a ground known as Ffordd Fer ('Short Way'), which was located where the local high school is now situated, and also wore red and white as their strip, just as the current team wears today in its home kit. There is evidence of a Holywell team existing way back in 1881, when a Holywell team lost in the first round of the 1881-82 Welsh Cup to Northwich Victoria, losing to the Cheshire side 0-3. Most recently, Holywell Town became founder members of the Cymru Alliance in 1990-91, and would compete in the league for two seasons, earning mid-table finishes both seasons. However, when a new national league for Wales was created, Holywell left the Cymru Alliance and they became one of the founder members of the new League of Wales in 1992-93.

Cymru Alliance

From the 1998-99 season, Holywell Town have played their football in the Cymru Alliance, the second tier of the Welsh football league system. Their first season back in the Alliance was a real struggle although the club avoided a potential relegation for the second season in a row, finishing several points above bottom club Corwen Amateurs, Matters improved in 2000-01 when The Wellmen rose to 10th position, mid-way in the league, in a season when they were one of six former League of Wales clubs to play in the Cymru Alliance. The following season, the club returned to struggling ways in the league, and in 2001-02 the Wellmen finished a disappointing 16th, narrowly avoiding relegation from the league yet again. It was then that the club decided to part company with their Manchester-based manager and squad in favour of a more local set-up in order to improve performances on the pitch. Unfortunately, their revised set-up fared no better when in 2002-03, they finished bottom - with a nine-point deduction adding to a dismal playing record.(1) Although they saw an improvement to fortunes under the guidance of Andy Nicholls during the 2004-05 season, finishing 9th, they were eventually relegated to the Welsh Alliance the following season when they finished 17th, with only their local rival Halkyn United below them. For the start of the 2012-13 season, Mike Thomas was replaced as Holywell manager by their club captain, Johnny Haseldin, who adopted a player-manager role. To aid him in his first management role, Haseldine brought in both John James and Andy Lewis (who were at Denbigh Town in the 2011-12 season) into his coaching staff, with Craig Knight remaining in his role from the previous

After years of trying in the Welsh Alliance, the 2014–15 season finally became Holywell's season when they finally clinched the Division 1 title. They maintained a 100% league record until January 2015 by winning their first fourteen league games, and only lost their first league game in mid-March. However they wrapped up the league title with three games remaining by beating Llanrwst United 3–0, and finally earned themselves promotion back to the Cymru Alliance for the 2015–16 season.

Holywell Town currently play at Halkyn Road, which is located just a short walk from Holywell town centre, behind the town's cottage hospital. The ground can accommodate 2,000 spectators with 500 seated with an additional 250 covered, with plenty of space for car parking behind the main stand. In recent times, the Halkyn Road ground has been greatly improved, such as increasing parking facilities, and the stadium has been the venue for many Youth International fixtures in the past.

The Wellmen's first choice strip is red and white striped shirts, red shorts and red socks, with the away strip being white and green hooped shirts and socks and green shorts. Although the team's local rivals are Greenfield, it is considered a friendly rivalry with good co-operation between the two clubs. Holywell's traditional and fiercest rivals are Flint Town United, which originates from the historical rivalry between the two old towns of Flintshire, and is one of the oldest football rivalries in Welsh league football! Holywell also has good local rivalries between fellow Flintshire sides, Mold Alexandra and Buckley Town, as well as recently having exciting competitive rivalries with Caernarfon Town, Denbigh Town and Holyhead Hotspur, which originate when the teams were competing for



BUCKLEY TOWN FOOTBALL CLUB GROUND REGULATIONS, THE GLOBE, GLOBE WAY, BUCKLEY

Notwithstanding possession of any ticket the Club, any police officer or authorised steward may refuse entry to (or eject from) the Ground any person that fails (or in the Club's reasonable opinion is likely to fail) to comply with these Ground Regulations and/or the Discrimination Commitment and/or the Supporter Code of Conduct and/or any reasonable instruction issued by a police officer or authorised steward or officer of the Club; and/or whose presence within the Ground is, or could (in the Club's reasonable opinion), constitute a source of danger, nuisance or annovance to any other person.

In the event of the postponement or abandonment of the Match, refunds (if any) will be made in accordance with the Club's terms and conditions of entry. The Club will have no further liability whatsoever, including (but not limited to) any indirect or consequential loss or damage, such as (but not limited to) loss of enjoyment or travel costs. All persons seeking entrance to the Ground and to refuse entry to or eject from the Ground any person refusing to submit to such a search. The following articles must not be brought within the Ground: knives, fireworks, smoke canisters, air-horns, flares, weapons, dangerous or hazardous items, laser devices, bottles, glass vessels, cans, poles and any article that might be used as a weapon and/or compromise public safety. Any person in possession of such items will be refused entry to the Ground. Further, you may not bring into the Ground any sponsorship, promotional or marketing materials save in respect of official club merchandise and/or other football related clothing worn in good faith; any flags or banners larger than those maximum dimensions permitted by the Club from time to time (or, in the absence of such stipulations, 2 metres x 1 metre) and/or of an offensive nature; nor may you offer (either free or for sale by any person) any goods (including literature) of any nature, without the express written approval of the Club's management. The use of threatening behaviour, foul or abusive language is strictly forbidden and will result in arrest and/or ejection from the Ground. The following acts are offences under the Football (Offences) Act 1991 (as amended): 12.1 The throwing of any object within the Ground without lawful authority or excuse. 12.2 The chanting of anything of an indecent or racialist nature. 12.3 The entry onto the playing area or any adjacent area to which spectators are not generally admitted without lawful authority or excuse. Conviction may result in a Banning Order being made. Nobody may stand in any seating area whilst play is in progress is s

The Globe and surrounding areas are smoke-free and smoking or the use of electronic cigarettes is not permitted inside the Ground.
