

Gresford Athletic FC



The history of the present-day Gresford Athletic stretches back to 1946, although it is known that the club existed in the 1920s.

Gresford Athletic won the 'West' Division of the Wrexham league in the 1946/47 season. The next time the club won a league trophy was in 1962/63, when they won Division 2 of the Wrexham league. In 1969, Division Three was split into two sections, A and B, with Gresford Athletic Reserves winning the Section A title.

The club remained in the Welsh National (Wrexham Area) League until the introduction of the Cymru Alliance League in the 1990/91 season, when they became one of the founder members of the league. They remained in the Cymru Alliance League for four seasons before being relegated back to the Welsh National League. During this four-year period, they reached the League Cup final, losing to a very strong Rhyl side.

They became champions of the Welsh National Premier League in the 1995/96 season, but due to financial difficulties, they could not meet the ground criteria for promotion back to the Cymru Alliance. During that season, Gresford Athletic Colts also won the Division 2 title. The following season, a new committee formed with the intention of taking the club back into the Cymru Alliance.

This was achieved in the 2000/01 season when they were once again champions of the Welsh National Premier League and with the finances in place, the committee managed to upgrade the club's home ground, Clappers Lane, to Cymru Alliance standards. In the same season, they were also beaten in the Welsh Trophy final.

Upon the re-structure of football in Wales, they re-entered the Welsh National Premier League in the 2010/11 season following nine seasons in the Cymru Alliance League. This proved to be a difficult season for the club, with them finishing in the bottom four. However, the following three seasons saw them steadily move up the league table.

The summer of 2014 saw a new management team and committee introduced at the club, which brought in a number of new players in and the emphasis both on and off the pitch being on achieving promotion to the Huws Gray Alliance. A 24-match unbeaten run saw them maintain a control on the league, whilst also seeing a successful run in the Welsh Cup, Welsh Trophy and League Cup competitions and it was January before they finally lost a game. However, the league title was not clinched until the final game of the season, by which time the work had been completed behind the scenes, with promotion having already been confirmed.

The 2015/16 season saw Gresford Athletic claim their highest ever finish in tier two, when they finished the season in sixth place. In the 2016/17 season, Gresford Athletic won the NEWFA Challenge Cup for the third time in their history. The final was played against Queens Park, with Gresford Athletic deservedly winning 3-2 at full time.

Gresford Athletic finished 11th in the first season of the JD Cymru North, which was cut short due to the COVID-19 pandemic, and are members of the JD Cymru North for the 2020/21 season.







BUCKLEY TOWN FOOTBALL CLUB GROUND REGULATIONS, THE GLOBE, GLOBE WAY, BUCKLEY

Notwithstanding possession of any ticket the Club, any police officer or authorised steward may refuse entry to (or eject from) the Ground any person that fails (or in the Club's reasonable opinion is likely to fail) to comply with these Ground Regulations and/or the Discrimination Commitment and/or the Supporter Code of Conduct and/or any reasonable instruction issued by a police officer or authorised steward or officer of the Club; and/or whose presence within the Ground is, or could (in the Club's reasonable opinion), constitute a source of danger, nuisance or annoyance to any other person.

In the event of the postponement or abandonment of the Match, refunds (if any) will be made in accordance with the Club's terms and conditions of entry. The Club will have no further liability whatsoever, including (but not limited to) any indirect or consequential loss or damage, such as (but not limited to) loss of enjoyment or travel costs. All persons seeking entrance to the Ground acknowledge the Club's right to search any person entering the Ground and to refuse entry to or eject from the Ground any person refusing to submit to such a search. The following articles must not be brought within the Ground: knives, fireworks, smoke canisters, air-horns, flares, weapons, dangerous or hazardous items, laser devices, bottles, glass vessels, cans, poles and any article that might be used as a weapon and/or compromise public safety. Any person in possession of such items will be refused entry to the Ground. Further, you may not bring into the Ground any sponsorship, promotional or marketing materials save in respect of official club merchandise and/or other football related clothing worn in good faith; any flags or banners larger than those maximum dimensions permitted by the Club from time to time (or, in the absence of such stipulations, 2 metres x 1 metre) and/or of an offensive nature; nor may you offer (either free or for sale by any person) any goods (including literature) of any nature, without the express written approval of the Club's management. The use of threatening behaviour, foul or abusive language is strictly forbidden and will result in arrest and/or ejection from the Ground. The following acts are offences under the Football (Offences) Act 1991 (as amended): 12.1 The throwing of any object within the Ground without lawful authority or excuse. 12.2 The chanting of anything of an indecent or racialist nature. 12.3 The entry onto the playing area or any adjacent area to which spectators are not generally admitted without lawful authority or excuse. Conviction may result in a Banning Order being made

The Globe and surrounding areas are smoke-free and smoking or the use of electronic cigarettes is not permitted inside the Ground.
